Henry VIII- Reformation

Key Vocabulary

Democracy – rule by the people

Empire – built by countries that wish to control lands outside of their borders.

governance – the term for the way a group of people such as a country do things.

Parliament – a group of people who make the laws for a country.

Monarch – a person who rules because one of their relatives ruled.

Reformation – a split in the Catholic Church where a new type of Christianity called Protestantism was born.

Catholic – base their beliefs on the Christian Bible.

Protestant – is a form of Christian faith
